



Knox County 2024 Elections

In **Primary** elections, party voters (Republicans and Democrats) choose their candidates for the next General election. In **General** elections, all voters choose their representatives from the primary winners and independent candidates. Primary elections are often **more** important than general elections, because that's where new candidates with fresh ideas need support to make it through to the general election.

Spring Election

Primary election for US President & delegates, county commission, school board, law director, and property assessor.

Voter registration ends Feb 5

Early voting from Feb 14 – 27

**Election Day is
Tuesday, March 5**

Summer Election

Federal & state **primary**, county **general**, and town of Farragut municipal election for the Board of Aldermen.

Voter registration ends July 2

Early voting from July 12 – 27

**Election Day is
Thursday, August 1**

Fall Election

Presidential, federal, and state **general** election. This election gets all the attention, but YOU have the biggest impact at the local level.

Voter registration ends October 7

Early voting October 16 – 31

**Election Day is
Tuesday, November 5**

Voting Tips

Prepare to vote

- 1) **Choose your voting location, date, and time.** Find the options on the county elections webpage, knoxcounty.org/election, including the early voting locations and schedule, as well as the precinct locations for voting on election day. The polls will be open only at precinct locations from 8am to 8pm on election day.
- 2) **Choose your races.** Use the *Voting Location Search* tool at [KGIS.org](https://kgis.org) to identify your districts. Then review the *Sample Ballot* from the county elections website and identify the races you care about that are in your districts.
- 3) **Choose your candidates.** There are many ways to collect candidate information. We advise using multiple sources, including candidate websites, local groups, candidate forums, news stories, endorsements, and voting records.

When you vote

- 1) **Bring your ID.** In Tennessee, Voter ID is required to help protect our election integrity.
- 2) **Bring your Sample Ballot** with your chosen candidates marked. Voting is quick and easy when it's with you in the voting booth.
- 3) **Vote like your liberty depends on it – because it does!**

Federal Offices

President – We'll leave this one and the associated delegates up to you.

County Commission

District 1 – **Justin Hirst's** priorities are to protect conservative values, deport illegal immigrants, support law enforcement in schools, and address homelessness, while holding the line on the budget.

District 4 – **Liz Tombras** is a longtime Knoxville advertising executive and a solid conservative with a Republican voting record. She has pledged to stand against tax increases and the establishment growth plan.

District 5 – **Angela Russell** is a proven leader, who recently won a fight against an inappropriate housing plan last fall. She is also an accountant who believes infrastructure must precede development with developers paying the cost.

District 6 – No recommendation.

District 8 – **Adam Thompson** is a 6th generation farmer, who is running to be a voice for the people, provide effective and efficient government, while being fiscally responsible.

District 9 – **Andy Fox** is a constitutional attorney and proven protector of the traditional, conservative character of Knox County. He fought against covid mandates and for our freedoms. He opposes the [Advance Knox Growth Plan](#).

Assessor and Law Director

Assessor of Property – **Jackie Raley** is a lifelong resident of Knox County and a conservative Republican. She has over nine years of experience working in the Assessor's office and has served as Chief Deputy Assessor since 2016.
